

2019 APA Missouri Annual Report:

- APA Missouri participated in a highly successful Quad-State Conference in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The Conference was a partnership with APA Arkansas, APA Kansas, and APA Oklahoma. Over 450 planners and allied professionals attended the two-and-a-half-day conference with over 60 CM credits offered.
- The Chapter developed the first Chapter Mission Statement of: The mission of APA Missouri is to advocate for the value of planning and to support planners and future planners through professional development and education in order to create great places.
- The Chapter developed the first Chapter Development Plan which outlines goals for a five-year time period.
- Created the first APA Missouri Diversity and Inclusion Committee.
- Held a successful Planners Day at the Capitol with nearly 20 professional planners meeting with legislators.
- Continued the successful Great Places in Missouri program with three honorees: Downtown Lee's Summit, High Street in Jefferson City, and Silver Moon Plaza in Chillicothe.

Ozark Mountain Section (OMS) highlights in support of the APA Missouri Work Plan

- Vision statement: Missouri leaders at the local and state level understand the value of planning to Missouri.
 - o Eight (8) OMS members participated in Planners Day at the Missouri Capitol
- Vision statement: APA Missouri and all sections have strong board leadership and financial management that effectively support the needs of an engaged membership.
 - OMS closed our account at Great Southern and opened one at Bank of America to be consistent with our State Chapter's banking practices. We also added the APA Missouri Treasurer to the list of people who have permission to view our account.
 - OMS created a template for meeting minutes that organizes the content based on the Chapter's work plan. After each board meeting, the OMS Secretary sends the meeting minutes to the APA Missouri Administrator to upload onto the APA Missouri Chapter website.
 - The OMS Board voted that all purchases or expenses greater than \$100 must receive board approval prior to being paid by our treasurer.
 - Section members voted to update to our bylaws that adds a Professional Development
 Officer (PDO) to our board, bringing our number of voting members up to eight.
 - The OMS Board voted to update our process of how we donate money to planning students in order to document that we are meeting financial needs while being good stewards of Section funds.

 - OMS conducted an annual survey of section members in which, 88 percent agreed that, "OMS provides helpful programming that enhances their professional knowledge and networking."
